#### SPORTS

In a moment of glory for Indian sports, the **Indian women's** cricket team won the 13th ICC Women's Cricket World Cup 2025 by defeating South Africa by 52 runs at Navi Mumbai. Shafali Verma shone with a brilliant 87 runs, while Deepti Sharma's 5-wicket haul sealed the victory. This is India's first-ever Women's World Cup



win, ending decades of hard work and inspiring millions of young girls across the country. Fans and leaders celebrated nationwide, calling it a proud moment for India.



India ended the 2025 Asian Youth Games in Manama, Bahrain with a **record haul** of 48 medals — the best ever for India at this meet. The medal tally included 13 gold, 18 silver and 17 bronze.

Young athletes across many sports brought glory — for example, a big moment came when Priteesmita Bhoi set a new

world-youth record in weightlifting clean & jerk to win gold.

# INDIAN POLITY

India has a new Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, Justice Surya Kant. He took charge on 24 November 2025, becoming the 53rd Chief Justice of India.

Justice Surya Kant was born in Hisar, Haryana, and studied law before starting his career as a lawyer. He later became a judge in different High Courts and then in the Supreme Court.

As the Chief Justice, he will lead the highest court in the country.



His job is to make sure that laws are followed and people get justice. He will serve as Chief Justice until February 2027

# INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS



Recently, UNICEF India has appointed national-award winning actor Keerthy Suresh as its new Celebrity Advocate for Child Rights.

In this role, Keerthy Suresh will use her public voice and popularity to support children's mental health, education, gender equality and overall well-being across India.

UNICEF India praised her

because she already has a strong connection with audiences and through her films has supported themes like empowerment, fairness and social change.

On **31 October 2025,** at the 43rd General Conference of UNESCO in Samarkand, Uzbekistan, Lucknow was officially declared a **Creative City of Gastronomy.** This means Lucknow, famous for its rich culinary heritage — especially its royal Awadhi cuisine — has earned a special



place on the global map of food and culture. Lucknow becomes only the **second Indian city** to receive this honour (after Hyderabad).

The recognition celebrates the city's famous dishes — like kebabs, biryani, chaat, street food and sweets — and honours centuries-old cooking traditions passed down through generations.



On26November 2025 — celebrated annually in India as Constitution Day — a bronze bust of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar was officially unveiled at UNESCO's headquarters in Paris.

The bust was unveiled by India's Permanent Representative to UNESCO, Vishal V. Sharma, in the presence of the Director-General of UNESCO, along with senior diplomats and dignitaries.

The plaque on the bust honours Ambedkar as the "Architect of the Indian Constitution — 70 Years (1950-2025) of the Indian Constitution."

### ENTERTAINMENT

On **21 November 2025,** Fátima Bosch of Mexico was crowned **Miss Universe 2025** at the grand finale held in Bangkok, Thailand.

Fátima represents the Mexican state of Tabasco — she is the **fourth woman from Mexico** in history to win the Miss Universe crown.

Before global competition, she first won the national competition, becoming Miss Universe Mexico 2025 in September 2025.



## WILDLIFE AND CONSERVATION

Recently, the Indian government has officially declared Gogabeel Lake in Katihar district, Bihar, as the country's **94th Ramsar Site**. Gogabeel is an **oxbow wetland** lying between the rivers Ganga River and Mahananda River. During floods, it connects with these rivers, forming a dynamic ecosystem.



The lake covers around **86.6 hectares** and is also the first **community-managed wetland reserve in Bihar** — meaning local people play a major role in conserving and using it.



The 30th session of the international climate-change summit under UNFCCC took place from 10 to 21 November 2025 in Belém, Brazil — a city on the edge of the Amazon rainforest.

This meeting brought together leaders and delegates from nearly all countries, along with scientists, indigenous communities, youth groups and civil-society organizations — all working to find global solutions for climate change.

The 20th G20 Leaders'
Summit was held in
Johannesburg, South Africa
on 22–23 November 2025
— the first time the summit
was hosted on African soil.
The summit's official theme
was "Solidarity, Equality,
Sustainability."
